


What are out-of-school programs?

Out-of-school programs include all opportunities and programs available to school-age youth outside of the school day including before school, after school, evening, during school breaks, on weekends, or during the summer. Programs can include one-time opportunities or programming offered on a consistent basis.

The Idaho Out-of-School Network and University of Idaho conducted a survey of 437 out-of-school programs across the state. This fact sheet represents 130 out-of-school programs in **Ada County.**

The City of Boise and YMCA provide the most out-of-school programs in Ada County.


25% SPACE Many programs offer their services free of charge, use a sliding scale, or provide scholarships.

46% of programs in Ada County have 3 employees or less, limiting the number of children that can participate in out-of-school programs.

Out-of-school programs in Ada County serve more than 33,400 youth each year.

More than one in three of these programs serve more than 500 youth each year.
