Our Impact

Supporting Youth Programs:

- The Idaho Out-of-School Network (ION) served more than 600 afterschool and summer youth programs in Idaho.
- Idaho youth programs helped more then
 48,000 youth (ages 5-18) explore the world
 beyond the classroom with academic support,
 enrichment activities, food, and transportation.
- ION awarded \$2.7 million to expand programs and increase affordability for families.
- Evaluators found more than 3.400 youth benefited socially and academically from ION funded programs.

Supporting Educators:

- ION served 1,917 professionals deidcated to enriching the lives of children through training, coaching, and sharing tools for success.
- Organized a professional development conference for 250 afterschool educators at the Power-Up Summit
- Expanded STEAM education (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts & Math) via an expanding network of educators and reached more than 30,000 youth.

Supprting Families:

- Improved long-term quality of youth programs through coaching and technical assisantace around ION's Building Blocks for OST quality.
- Increased community support for partnerships for afterschool and summer programs.
- Advocated for more resources to help families access youth programs.

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BY THE NUMBERS

- Over 1,000 educators attended an ION event or training, for one or more of ION's 28 in person professional events
- 250 educators attended Power-Up Summit
- 115 educators attended the Behavior Management Institute
- Convened 6 Regional Roundtables
- 90 programs received coaching focuses on behavior management and the Idaho Building Blocks for Out-of-School Time Quality
- 60,000 people engaged with Think Make Create Mobile Makerspace Labs
- Coordinated 1,581 hours of STEM educational sessions for youth afterschool

LEARNING ACADEMY

- ION launched the Learning Academy in September 2022; 300 learners registered by the year's end
- ION hosted 10 webinars

HIGHLIGHTS

- Utah Education Policy Center (UEPC) found that 94% of educators reported that youth who attended afterschool programs, had greater success throughout the school year
- ION Awarded \$2.7 million for operating youth OST programs across the state!
