- 2. Publicize accomplishments of OST Champions



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


What is out-of-school time?



Kids spend 80% of their waking hours outside of their school day.

Youth in OST programs outperform their peers in reading scores, homework completion, class participation and improved behavior



Key Message #1:

Afterschool means opportunity





ION has registered more than 500 OST programs which are attended by more than 30,000 youth (K-12)

For every child in an afterschool program, 4 more are waiting to get in

Kids need more opportunities

Across the country, one in five kids are alone or unsupervised afterschool

The hours of 2 pm to 6 pm are peak hours for juvenile crime



Key Message #2:

Idaho needs to Focus on Fridays



50% of Idaho school districts no longer have school on Fridays.



Many programs such as 21st Century Learning Centers, Extension 4-H, Boys & Girls Clubs and rural libraries focus on Friday youth programs to fill the gap left by reduced school schedules



ION Success:

Since 2014, ION has trained more than 4,000 afterschool and summer educators.
