CONNECTED WITH PROGRAMS AND PARTNERS

Presented **ION's Building Blocks for Quality** in a series of eight web workshops. Started the process of Impact Mapping

Connected educators with multiple resources and presenters through **our web workshop series** including topics such as Adolescent Brain Science, Girls Who Code, Behavior Tips & Tricks, Preparing for Reopening, and Understanding the Impact of Trauma on Kids.

Continued to build the **Idaho Dimensions of Success (DoS) Certified Observation Team**. ION also served as a remote DoS Observation pilot for the PEAR Institute.

Created **three Program Profiles** showcasing excellence in out-of-school time programming throughout the state.

Piloted a **Middle School Pilot Program** with the City of Boise Parks and Rec, a high-quality program designed using The Building Blocks for Quality and the 12 course "BOTVIN: Lifeskills Training" as curriculum. Held staff nights and parent nights to teach **Adolescent Brain Science**.

Partnered with The Idaho Positive Behavior Network to hold the first annual **Behavior Management Institute (BMI)**. Designed for out-of-school teams, BMI provides research-based strategies to providers serving all ages of youth in an out-of-school time settings. 95 people in 20 teams attended.

Connected with 125 out-of-school professionals at **ION's 7th Annual Power Up Summit** held virtually and in conjunction with the **Open Minds Open Spaces Western States Conference**, a regional conference with participants from nine states.

Brought **Think Make Create (TMC) Labs™** to Idaho in partnership with University of Idaho 4-H, Idaho STEM Action Center, Idaho Career & Technical Education, and Gizmo. TMC Labs™ **will serve K-8, rural, and under-resourced youth across the state** providing quality STEM programming through these outdoor mobile maker spaces.



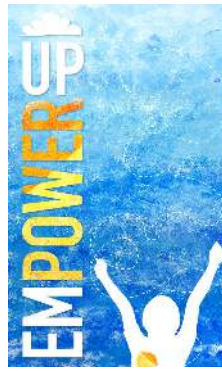

Hosted the **Open Minds Open Space Town Hall meeting as part of Lights On Afterschool** to recognize and honor those that champion afterschool and **honored seven Lights On Afterschool Champions**. Proclamations designating Lights on Afterschool Day were made by Governor Brad Little and Mayor Lauren McLean.

Together with the National League of Cities, held a series of three **Town Hall Meetings** throughout the summer with policy makers to discuss the critical role that OST plays during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Participated in the first ever **STEM Ecosystem Initiative**- co-purchasing the Think Make Create Labs and building a statewide leadership team to implement **the project statewide** in 2021.

ION Director completed the **White Riley Peterson Policy Fellowship**.
